FILM FESTIVAL SELECTS YBOR, BREAKS RECORDS

The Gasparilla International Film Festival expanded its schedule and broke attendance records in 2013 with more than 13,000 people attending the seventh annual event. Three of the festival's six days of film screenings, workshops, panels and parties were held in Ybor City locations, including Muvico Centro Ybor, Hillsborough

"We couldn't have asked for a more wonderful way to celebrate film in our region," said Gasparilla International Film Festival board president Joseph Restaino. A dynamic lineup of films and participation from talented filmmakers and actors helped make the 2013 festival a success.

Tampa residents can expect even more film in the city's future.

Hillsborough commission chairman Ken Hagan recently announced plans to create a nonprofit film commission to increase film production within Hillsborough County. The decision was made, in part, based on 2012 report that shows only 9 percent of film production in Florida is done in Hillsborough County. The new commissioner would be expected to market the county to producers and directors.

MURAL NEARS COMPLETION

The Adamo Drive mural project, a massive depiction of life both past and present in Ybor City, will be dedicated Tuesday, May 21 at 2 p.m. Mayor Bob Buckhorn will lead the dedication ceremony.

The 12,000-square-foot mural, believed to be the largest outdoor original artwork in Florida, stretches more than 360 feet along Adamo Drive east of 17th Street.

Artistic director Michael Parker designed and produced the mural, assisted by community volunteers and art students from Hillsborough Community College Ybor Campus. Financial support came from more than 20 contributors and in-kind sponsors, including the City of Tampa and Ybor City Development Corp.

The mural encompasses six scenes with three common themes: The Journey through Life; The Conflict between Tradition and Progress; and The American Experience.

EXPANDING THE YBOR CITY COMMUNITY



Stacy Richards and her husband Jorge Garcia have reincarnated a Tampa icon at Seabreeze Ybor, 1604 N. 17th Street, with family recipes for deviled crabs and other local favorites.

Venatôre, an information technology solutions provider, has moved into a 4,800 square-foot office in Corral Wodiska factory, 1302 N. 19th Street. The former cigar factory was rehabilitated in 1999 and now blends historical elements with a modern design.

S3 Media, an interactive marketing and website design agency, has relocated its offices within the historic district to 1717 E. 5th Avenue.

New eateries and restaurant expansions create more options for dining in historic Ybor City:

- Yo Boys Frozen Yogurt has opened at 1815 E. 7th Avenue. The frozen yogurt shop flavors include low fat, fat-free, gluten free, dairy free and no-sugar varieties and changes featured flavors bi-weekly.
- Tequila's Taco Bar, 1613 E. 7th Avenue, is now open. While the restaurant boasts more than 150 types of tequila, it also serves Mexican cuisine including burritos, tacos and house-made guacamole.

Mayor Buckhorn will celebrate the resurgence of restaurants on the 1900 block of 7th Avenue with a special ribbon cutting ceremony at 4 p.m. on May 8. Two new restaurants - Istanblu and Sunday's Delicatessen - and the expansion of Stone Chef Catering & Events add to the diverse cuisines available in historic Ybor City.

STREETSCAPE ENHANCEMENTS

Progress is being made on the 7th Avenue extension project, which expands the look of the historic district beyond the 22nd Street intersection. The City of Tampa and Ybor City Development Corp. are now working to improve the streetscape between 23rd and 24th Street as part of a four-block plan to make the sidewalk more inviting and comfortable for pedestrians.

The streetscape improvements include benches, historic-style lampposts, litter baskets, and Cabbage Palm trees. Distinctive brick pavers will line the sidewalk, and parking spaces are being added along 7th Avenue. The amenities will continue the historic ambiance of the district into the mostly residential neighborhood.

The City of Tampa has taken a blockby-block approach to improve the streetscape along 7th Avenue between 22nd and 26th Streets. The 2200 block was completed a few years ago, and the 2300 block is scheduled to be completed in late May or early June.

The popular <u>Tropical Heatwave</u>, presented by WMNF Community Radio, expands this year to a two-day festival. The extravaganza of eclectic and exotic entertainment takes

over Ybor City on Friday, May 10 and Saturday, May 11. More than 60 local and national acts will play on 10 stages.

On May 15, two planned museums make significant progress toward opening. Florida Department of Transportation will relocate two homes from V.M. Ybor to 19th Street near 9th Avenue as part of the Interstate Historic Mitigation Plan. The homes will be rehabilitated and renovated into the Al Lopez Baseball Museum and the Law Enforcement Museum.
